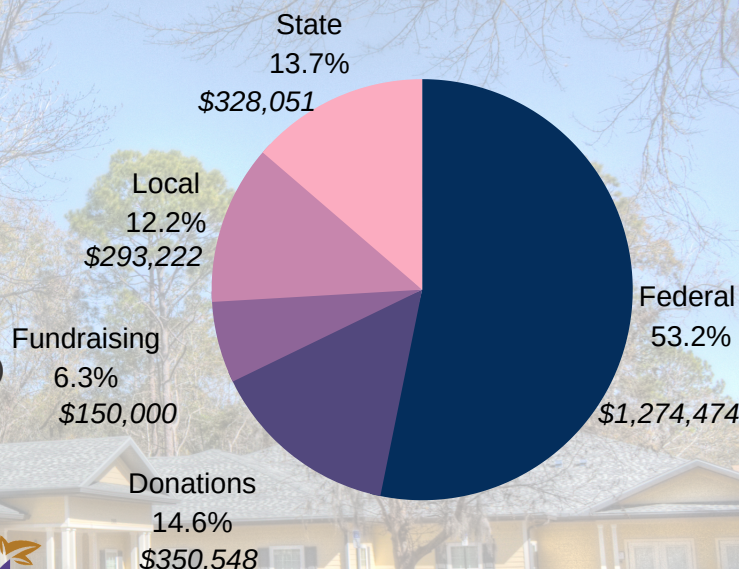
2019-20 Services Provided
